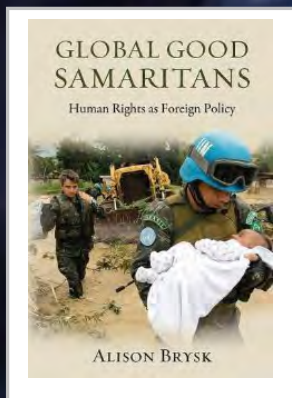


Human Rights as Global Social Imagination



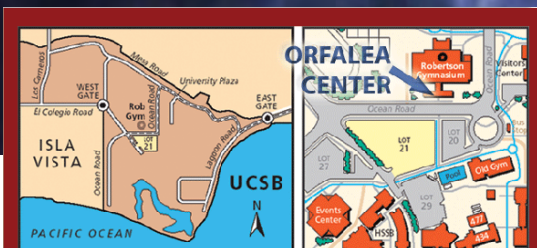
